On 24th May 2019 our school “Istituto Superiore di Riposto” celebrated the Europe Day and on this occasion we invited the Representative of the local authorities and the students and teachers of the low secondary schools located in the town of Riposto. At the main gate of the school and in the hall we

displayed the European Flags and posters showing the map of Europe and the most famous landmarks of the European countries. Moreover we arranged the learning environment for the celebration. We chose four large classrooms equipped with interactive white boards so the students were enabled to give presentations about Europe, culture and traditions of a selection of European Countries (Italy, Spain, France, Uk). The EU hymn and music from EU countries were played and video and picture were shown and quizzes were delivered. Moreover desks were arranged in angular u-shape and on them were placed typical dishes and cakes from those countries including Italy. Some of those cakes such as “muffins” and “cheese cakes” from Uk,



were prepared from students’ mothers or bought at the school cafeteria. Actually the “arancino”, the typical Sicilian ball of fried rise with Ragu’ Bolognese inside, was cooked inside one the classroom using a huge deep fryer. The students representing the



Italian culture wore red, white and green t-shirts and they stood in a row to resemble the Italian Flag.

This event was very successful and it has been one of the strategies we apply in order to foster the European awareness and to enhance interest towards other cultures and traditions. Developing intercultural skills and citizenship competence are the goals we want our students to achieve during the learning process and little by little we are getting on the right track.
